Robert was born in Ephraim, Utah, the third child of Teckla Pauline Christensen Nielson and Andrew Christian Nielson, Jr. His years as a youth were spent in Ephraim, helping with a busy family in its many endeavors. Much was expected of each of the children for the good of the family and Robert did his fair share.

Lenore Lewis was born in Vernal, Utah, the first child of Charles Preston Lewis and Crystal Dean Potter Lewis. There were many of the Lewis relatives also living in the area and she grew up knowing good times with extended family.

Robert and Lenore met in Vernal--the area was a government assignment for Robert. They were married in 1935.

Teckla Joanne arrived in 1936, with Carolyn Lou becoming part of the family in 1938, Sharon in 1940 and Paula Rochelle in 1945.

Many places were called home for the family--Salt Lake City, Albuquerque, New Mexico, back to Salt Lake and then to Billings, Montana, which was really the place they called home.
